RECOMMENDATION

Authorize two new Code Enforcement Officer positions in the Development Services Department and approve budget adjustment 13-008.

BACKGROUND

In June 2012, the City Council adopted a \$4.6 million dollar operating and capital improvement budget for the Economic and Development Services Department. That budget included the following Code Enforcement staffing:

- One full-time Chief of Code Enforcement
- Two full-time Code Enforcement Officers assigned to the CDBG areas of the City
- Two full-time Code Enforcement Officers assigned to the remainder of the City
- Two part-time Code Enforcement Officers available to work City-wide

Based on City Council's direction and community desire to provide more comprehensive Code Enforcement coverage, the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) directed staff to prepare a report to request two additional Code Enforcement Officer positions to fulfill the needed duties.

<u>ANALYSIS</u>

There is a significant need for additional resources to manage workload related to Code Enforcement to provide a higher quality of life in the community. At this time, due to limited resources and assignment of some existing officers to Neighborhood Improvement Task Force (NITF), the remaining Code Enforcement Officers are responding reactively; that is, they are responding to complaints only and do not have the ability to seek out Code violations proactively. Two additional Code Enforcement Officers will result in four officers assigned to the majority of the City which lies outside

the CDBG area, allowing for proactive enforcement throughout their assigned areas. Therefore, staff recommends the City Council approval for the addition of two new Code Enforcement Officer positions which significantly affect the efforts in improving community quality of life.

ALTERNATIVES

The Council could decide to "receive and file" this report.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

The annual budget impact of the requested two Code Enforcement Officer positions is \$159,934. However, for FY 2012-13, only funding for eight months is requested, therefore attached Budget Adjustment 13-008 is for the amount of \$106,623 from the General Fund - Fund Balance.

LEGAL ANALYSIS

Legal review is not required.

CONCLUSION

Due to a significant need in the community to provide proactive enforcement throughout the City, staff is seeking authorization for two additional Code Enforcement Officers in the Development Services Department.
