


OPEN SPACE

Costa Mesa rests on a natural plateau that leads to the ocean and is nestled between the Santa Ana River and Newport Bay. Hop on a bike and take a leisurely cruise to the beach or ride the numerous trails which follow the natural landscape surrounding Costa Mesa. For a longer adventure, drive to the mountains, desert, or forests within an hour of the City; Costa Mesa is in close proximity of two National Parks and six State Parks and much more. Costa Mesa offers 32 parks which provide a full range of recreational opportunities, including the 210-acre Fairview Park and recently redesigned Lion's Park.




