2018 Pedestrian and Biking Safety Key Facts and Statistics

- Pedestrian fatalities account for nearly 25 percent of all roadway deaths in California. (National Highway Traffic Safety Administration)
- Nearly 7,000 people died in pedestrian-related traffic incidents in California between 2006 and 2015. (Pedestrian and Bicycle Information Center)
- California's pedestrian fatality rate is almost 70 percent higher than the national average. (National Highway Traffic Safety Administration)
- No state has more pedestrian deaths on its roadways than California. (National Highway Traffic Safety Administration)
- In 2015 alone, there were 59 children (between the ages of 0 and 19) killed in pedestrian-related incidents. (Safe Kids)
