4. Approval of the Minutes of the June 28, 2018 Meeting of the PRC

5. Public Comments

- 1. Rick Huffman, spoke about the Costa Mesa Tennis Center, its current operators and month-to-month contract.
- 2. Terry Koken, spoke about the Costa Mesa Fish Fry and proposed that it should be moved back to Lions Park once the Lions Park Projects' construction allows.
- 3. Kim Hendricks, spoke about wanting to change Fairview Park's name, the location of the Fish Fry and requested a proposal for an overall restoration plan for Fairview Park.

Chair McNabb closed Public Comments.

6. Commissioner Comments

Chair McNabb – Spoke about the Costa Mesa Tennis Center, the Fish Fry's location, and the idea of renaming Fairview Park; and thanked staff for summer events and programs.

Vice Chair Reynolds – Spoke about the Costa Mesa Tennis Center operator, upcoming events, and the desire from the community for more special events; asked if the Animal

Services Committee has brainstormed how best to handle dog leash violations and about increasing access to parks and Luke Davis Field; highlighted the Costa Mesa Senior Center; and congratulated the Mayor's Cup participants.

Commissioner Bogner – Spoke about the contract with the current Tennis Center operator, wildlife at Fairview Park, the Fish Fry, and dogs off leash.

Commissioner Erickson – Spoke about the opportunities to program performing arts events at the TeWinkle Park theater, and bicycle instructional areas and a mini skate park at Ketchum-Libolt Park.

Commissioner Ersoylu – Spoke about the location of the Fish Fry, Luke Davis Field, and how we may be able to deter people from allowing their dogs to go off leash.

a) Costa Mesa Skate Park Operating Hours Summer Pilot Program Update

Chair McNabb closed Public Comments.

Commissioner Erickson spoke about schools not yet being back in session and that once classes start, they may affect the usage of the skate park, morning dew may affect the safety of the park once the seasons change, and about continuing the pilot program.

Vice Chair Reynolds spoke about being pleased with the hours, wanting to extend the pilot program longer, the community liking the additional hours, and being appreciative of the City's outreach efforts and outreach results.

Commissioner Ersoylu spoke about the evening hours being most popular and continuing the pilot program.

Commissioner Bogner spoke about wanting to see participation in organized programs at the skate park.

Chair McNabb spoke about considering a later start time in the morning.

Commissioner Ersoylu asked about the OCME board size, the board's age demographics, the importance of succession planning, grant applications and if the 90-day termination clause was in the original contract.

Chair McNabb thanked OCME for their dedication to Fairview Park.

the license agreement with the Orange County Model Engineers for a period of twenty years, with the option to extend the term for two additional five-year periods, and that the City shall pay all fees and charges in connection with the scheduling of regular pick-ups of trash generated from the premises, on a weekly basis/Seconded by Commissioner Ersoylu. Vice Chair Reynolds asked if an entrance to Canyon Park will be closing temporarily for a construction project, when Pinkley, Shalimar and Gisler Parks will be updated, and how the organic pesticide maintenance program is going at Luke Davis Field.

11. Parks and Community Services Director's Report

Chair McNabb asked if the Teen Camp program would be expanded and about recent animal adoption numbers.

Vice Chair Reynolds asked if the temporary lighting at Rea Elementary School fields will be continued and if bicycle training could be incorporated into recreational programming.

Commissioner Bogner spoke about the dog leash violations noted in the park ranger report.

Commissioner Erickson spoke about bicycle safety programs.
