## 2019 ANALYSIS OF ANIMAL OPERATIONS

2019 marked another successful year for Costa Mesa's Animal Care Services operations. The three-pronged approach involving Animal Control, Newport Center Animal Hospital, and Priceless Pet Rescue continues to provide Below are highlighted 2019 statistics: great care to the City's impounded and adoptable animals.

Animal Care Services and the Animal Services Committee have remained busy providing pet-related events, introduced the Paws 101 video series, and continue • Returned to Owner: 158 promoting impounded and adoptable animals.

Costa Mesa contracts with Newport Center Animal Hospital • Adoptions: 505 to provide animal shelter services. The shelter is located at 1333 Avocado Avenue in Newport Beach. Priceless Pet Rescue provide the contracted animal adoption services and their adoption center, The Orphanage, is located at 1536 • Live Release Rate: 92.2% Newport Blvd. in Costa Mesa.

## **ANIMAL SERVICES OPERATIONS**



February is "Spay/Neuter Awareness Month." Not only does spaying or neutering your pet help decrease the amount of homeless animals in shelters, but it also provides medical and behavioral benefits.

A spayed female pet will live a longer, healthier life, which helps decrease the chance of uterine infections and breast tumors. Spaying before your pet's first heat is highly recommended. For male pets, neutering prevents testicular cancer and prostate problems.

Behaviorally, females will not go into heat and males are less likely to roam away from the home looking for a mate. In fact, the cost of the procedure is much cheaper than caring for a litter. In addition, male dogs and cats *may* behave better once neutered.

Dogs and cats vary on age when to spay or neuter your pet. For cats, kittens can undergo the surgery as early as eight weeks old. Dogs on the other hand, traditionally wait until six to nine months; however, puppies are able to be spayed or neutered earlier as long as they are healthy.

Please consult your veterinarian to determine the best time to spay or neuter your pet.

## **ANIMAL SERVICES COMMITTEE GOALS**

The Animal Services Committee has accomplished a majority of their 2019 goals. As they move into the new year, the Committee plans to renew their goals for 2020 in January.

- 1. Complete contract agreements with Newport Center Animal Hospital and Priceless Pet Rescue in the first quarter of 2019. **COMPLETED**
- 2. Produce a public service announcement, in print and in video, related to the three-pronged partnership with Animal Control, Newport Center Animal Hospital, and Priceless Pet Rescue. **COMPLETED**
- 3. Educate the public on responsible pet ownership and care, with regard to City ordinances and frequently asked questions, no less than six times per year. **COMPLETED**

- 4. Consider and make a recommendation to the City Council regarding ordinances related to the existing TNR (Trap, Neuter, Release) Program. **IN PROCESS**
- 5. Research and create a list of service providers that can provide low-cost vaccinations and/or a voucher program for Costa Mesa residents for spay and neuter. **COMPLETED**
- 6. Assist Animal Control with promotion and education related to coyotes and the Coyote Management Plan.

- 7. Cooperate and coordinate with the Parks and Community Services, Animal Care Services, events, initiatives, and projects. **COMPLETED**

# ANIMAL CONTROL DOG LICENSING

Being a dog owner requires a variety of responsibility, but often times the one that goes overlooked is licensing your pet. Licensing your dog is quick, affordable, and necessary.

So what are the benefits to licensing your dog?

#### It's the Law

The State of California and the City of Costa Mesa require that all dogs four months of age that reside within City limits must be licensed on a yearly basis. A dog license must be worn at all times, attached to a collar or harness.

## **Properly Vaccinated**

When licensing a dog, the owner must provide an updated rabies vaccination certificate.

## Quicker Return Home

Licensing your dog increases the chance of your dog's return home. Stray dogs who are licensed are returned home often times before the dog is taken to the shelter.

#### **Affordable**

Dog licenses are affordable. For a spayed/neutered dog the annual fee is \$25, while an unaltered dog is \$80. If you are 62 years old or older, the fees are discounted to \$10 and \$40. These fees are much cheaper than receiving a fine.

### Simple and Easy

Licensing is so simple, you don't even have to leave home. You can apply online at www.costamesaca.gov or you can scan the QR code below to be directed to the website. You can also apply in person with the Parks and Community Services Department on the 3rd Floor of City Hall.


