Patricia Santry, Irvine, Second Harvest Food Bank, announced the upcoming USPS food drive, "Stamp Out Hunger."

Janice Davidson, Costa Mesa, spoke about the employee suicide and Council's recent actions.

Sue Lester, Costa Mesa, commented on a recent lawsuit filed by the City that was against her business.

Greg Thunell, Costa Mesa, referencing recent actions by the Council spoke in support of maintaining City employees.

James Proctor, Costa Mesa, recommended drilling oil in the City.

Helen Evers, Costa Mesa, spoke in opposition of Council's recent actions and of outsourcing.

Karin Ahlf, Costa Mesa, spoke in opposition of discharging fireworks for more than one night.

Sandra Genis, Costa Mesa, spoke in opposition of the proposed ordinance.
