3. Community Need:

The 2020 Census Bureau shows that 11.3% of Costa Mesa residents are 65 or older and 11.9% live in poverty. The CDC reports that 1/3 of adults 45+ feel lonely, and nearly ¼ of adults 65+ are considered to be socially isolated. Socially isolated individuals have increased health risk such as dementia, heart disease and risk of stroke. Loneliness is prevalent in our senior population leads to higher rates of depression, anxiety, and suicide. During the height of the pandemic, research from Boston University showed that depression among adults jumped from 8.5% before the pandemic to 27.8% and worsened to 32.8% in 2021. Research from National Institute of Mental Health shows in 2021 that almost 60% of people who have depression don't seek help. Our neighbors who are widowed, disabled and elderly are more likely to experience these issues and not ask for help. Labors of Love seeks to identify neighbors who are currently living in hard circumstances and could use community support offering to help with a needed manual labor project. In the fiscal year of 2022-2023 we were contacted by 60 individuals who were in need of assistance with their properties.

4. Organization Capacity & Experience:

State your organization's experience in carrying out the proposed program including information about the length of time the organization has provided the proposed service(s), partnerships & collaborations with other nonprofits and jurisdictions, staff qualifications and other relevant information.

In the 10 years we've existed, we've responded to numerous requests from the City to help residents who were in code violation. We've successfully mobilized volunteers to help meet those needs. Over the years as our "neighboring network—to over 200 people, we've continued to meet neighbors' needs as able through mobilizing volunteers. We've served elderly neighbors, dealt with hoarders' homes/yards, and helped widows with overgrown yards to name just a few projects. Our organization has coordinated—Love Costa Mesa Day" for the last 6 years and has mobilized several thousand volunteers in the community to accomplish 158 projects. Our Executive Director, lan Stevenson, formally coordinated many of these types of projects in his pastoral role at The Crossing Church for 27 years. The program director, Reina Cuthill, has a bachelor's degree from UC Irvine in psychology and has broad experience in volunteer mobilization.
