- 1) Artist Showcases
 - 270 artists were emailed on upcoming Artist Showcases

Artist Showcase XV

• Held at Whittier Law School (3333 Harbor Blvd) on Saturday, April 21 from 6-9 pm. All art was juried and 21 artists (10 new artists) exhibited juried selected piece(s) (45 pieces shown) of art. A featured artist was selected to use their art piece as the graphics for the flyer and allowed to display all three submitted pieces. Mesa Art and Framing, Location 1980 and Engard Arts displayed pieces. The venue and entertainment were donated. Entertainment provided by SCFTA (drum circle) was very popular and interactive. SCFTA had a table to promote their events. SOY provided youth volunteers to set up and tear down the event. 200 people visited the showcase.

Artist Showcase XVI

- Held at the ARTery located at the LAB (2930 Bristol Street) on Saturday, October 20 from 6-9 pm. All art was juried and 22 artists (13 new artists) exhibited juried selected piece(s) (75 pieces shown) of art. A featured artist was selected to use their art piece as the graphics for the flyer and allowed to display all three submitted pieces. Mesa Art and Location 1980 displayed pieces. The venue and entertainment were donated. Entertainment was provided by DJ Kaboom. SOY provided youth volunteers to tear down the event. Wine Lab partnered with the committee on providing wine and a sommelier. 225 people visited the showcase.
- 2) Held the first "Arts in the Park" event at Estancia Park on August 25 from 9 am-12 pm. Seven non-profits (All American Boys Choir, Arts and Learning, Cultural Arts Committee, Human Options, Love&Art, Segerstrom's "The Center Arts/Teach" and Save Our Youth) provided crafts and their organization's information. All American Boys Choir and Arts and Learning provided 45-minute visual performances. Location 1980 provided a live artist. One hundred people attended the event.

- 3) Partnered with Segerstrom's "The Center Arts/Teach" to provide two craft artists and donated face painting as well as other craft supplies for three of the concerts during the summer Concerts in the Park series.
- 4) Partnered with SOBECA on the "Art Walk" event held the last Tuesday of each month. The first "Art Walk" was on Tuesday, November 27 from 6-10 pm located at the LAB and CAMP. The Committee assisted with providing artists for the event as well as displaying art in the ARTery. Entertainment was provided by DJ Kaboom. SOY provided youth volunteers to assist with the event.

 - AABC, Arts&Learning, SOY, CMHS/EHS, Love&Art, Girls Inc, MIKA and Boys and Girls Club have committed to participating. Waldorf and the Center's Art Teach will let Lisa know by the end of January if they can participate. Human Options and Shalimar Learning Center is unable to attend.
 - A planning meeting was held before the meeting at 5:30. The following was discuss
 - Purpose is to raise awareness of youth groups within our community and provide a fundraiser and networking opportunity amongst the non-profits youth organizations.
 - o **Main focus will be to market and promote** the free community family event to receive large attendance at the event. FREE arts, crafts music, live DJ, and great performances with the Adobe House open to the public.
 - More and better advisement is essential; start advertising in March
 - Create a passport so youth are encourage to attend each organizations booth; each organization will give a sticker and once the youth has created all the stickers, then they can be entered into a raffle drawing;

- o Five organizations will be given a 45-minute performance slot (15 minutes to set up and 25-30 minutes to perform
 - Tony will handle the performance schedule
 - Eddie (2012 OC DJ) will DJ during setups
 - AABC will provide performance area equipment
- o Organizations will be given a map for them to setup their own table, chairs, EZ ups, and materials to provide Mother's Day themed craft
- o Use two of the City's generators for performance area
- o Use Estancia storage room for a dressing room
- o Lisa G will conduct the Cultural Arts Committee arts project
- o A second planning meeting will be scheduled at 5:30pm on March 14 to finalize the event

 - Paint Mob idea (have artists paint different places around CM) and competition with money awards
 - Closing ceremony at OCC, showcasing student art projects, films and reception using OCC culinary school
 - o Possibility for OCC art exhibition, film series and reception
 - Have a Costa Mesa feature artist, Frank is suggesting Scott Kenny (a 60-year-old Costa Mesa artist)
 - Partner with SOBECA on expanding the July Art Walk onto Randolph street (small street fair with live music, art performances and live art)
 - Subcommittees were discussed; Frank is the only one on the Art programs committee; subcommittees will meet before the January 17 meeting.
- Opening ceremony planned for June 29th (6/29/53 was the day Costa Mesa was incorporated)
